

Parts of Speech





NOUN

Nouns are the names of people, places, things, or ideas. They can function as subjects, objects, or possessives. eg, boy, market, book





PRONOUN

Pronouns are used in place of nouns to avoid repetition. They refer to people, places, things, or ideas previously mentioned. eg, she, they, it

she/her he/him they/them



VERB

Verbs express actions, states of being, or occurrences in a sentence."They are taking exercise"





ADVERB

Adverbs modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. They describe how, when, where, or to what extent an action takes place. "She is coming soon", "She played the piano beautifully". soon and beautifully are adverbs.





ADJECTIVE

It is a word used to modify or describe a noun or pronoun. It usually answers the question of which one, what kind, or how many. Eg, crazy cat, beautiful view, a dozen eggs.





PREPOSITION

Prepositions show relationships between other words in a sentence. They indicate location, direction, time, and more. Eg, "The cat is sitting on the table"





CONJUNCTION

Conjunctions connect words, phrases, or clauses. They help establish relationships and flow between different parts of a sentence. Sara and Amy are friends. "and " is the conjuction.





INTERJECTION

Interjections are short exclamations that express strong emotions or reactions. They are often followed by an exclamation mark. Eg, "Wow, this is amazing!. "Wow" is an interjection.
